#### **Drafting of human resources rules for local government**

Bhutan, World Bank Individual Consultant, 2010

With the introduction of elected local government in Bhutan new provisions were required for a range of issues relating to administrative machinery and human resources. The work included stakeholder consultation, preparation of a report and draft rules.

#### **Institutional strengthening, roads legislation**

India, Bihar State, ADB (TA), 2009, 2010

Drafting of laws providing for administration of roads and funding of road maintenance, creation of a road maintenance fund, provision for establishment of toll roads and review of road offence enforcement.

#### **Institutional Support – Law Making Process, Indonesia, UNDP 2009.**

The Department of Law and Human Rights occupies a central place in the process of making and reviewing legislation in Indonesia – including laws made in all sectors, both nationally and locally. With the impending completion of an institutional support program (“CAPPLER”), there was a need to review support to date and to identify future support needs.

**Drafting revised Local Government Act, draft Planning Act and rules for Land Pooling**  
Bhutan Ministry of Works and Human Settlement, 2008, 2009.

With the establishment of a system of elected local government (*Thromde*) in urban areas, and with urban expansion, there was a need for new and revised legislation, including:

- a *Planning Act* capable of early implementation;
- revised local government legislation dealing with *Thromde* (urban) councils;
- a method of reconfiguring property boundaries which facilitates transition of rural land to becoming urban land in a way that is equitable and effective.

**Drafting and Implementation of Road Traffic Act Reforms**

Botswana Ministry of Works and Transport, 2008

The Botswana Ministry of Works and Public Transport and Department of Road Transport and Safety, working through a Reference Group, engaged Campbell to prepare a Gap Analysis of existing laws and proposed amendments, review draft legislation, undertake a program of consultation with Government and private sector stakeholders, and to finalise a package of regulatory reforms intended to achieve higher compliance levels by drivers.


